

GEORGE JOHNSTON MUSEUM

This log museum, in the centre of Teslin is a heritage gem with excellent professionally-designed displays of Tlingit native ceremonial regalia, hunting artefacts, and rare native photographs. Displays and a film theatre tell the story of venerated Elder Kash Klaa (George Johnston) and the Tlingits.

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Before the Alaska Highway was built, Teslin was a remote, paddle wheeler outpost where people hunted, trapped and fished off the Land. Venerated Tlingit Elder, photographer, trapper and entrepreneur George Johnston used his 1928 Chev to hunt and taxi in a wilderness, roadless until 1943.
