Complete your Klondike experience by exploring the Dänojà Zho Cultural Centre.



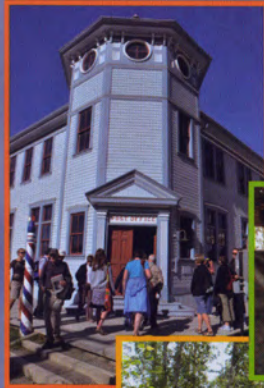

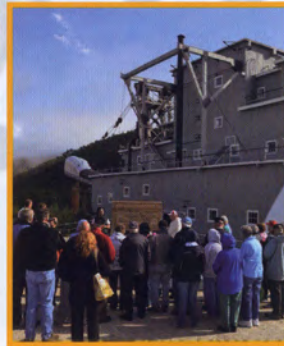
Trace the footsteps of the Stampeders...Dawson City boasts more than two dozen historic sites, including many fully restored and interpreted by Parks Canada staff.
